Investment Objective

The investment objective of the Pan-European International Equity Mutual Fund is to provide the unit holder with capital growth, by investing mainly in stocks of the European Markets. The Fund is actively managed relative to the Benchmark and its purpose is to provide investors with longterm capital growth.

Investment Strategy

The Fund invests mainly in large-cap and liquid stocks of companies listed in main European Markets. The selection of these stocks is based on a variety of criteria regarding the fundamentals of the selected company, the earnings growth prospects, the quality and effectiveness of management teams and market valuation.

Performance fee

Up to 15% on any positive difference between the performance of the NAV per unit and the performance of the STOXX Europe 50 Price EUR index. Q1 Commentary

In the first quarter of 2025, European stock markets returned +5.18%, according to the Stoxx Europe 600 index (which tracks the 600 largest European stocks). The main reasons for the upward move were:

- 1. Trump's tariff policy created uncertainty in the markets, resulting in increased investment flows into European equities due to their lower valuations and lower weightings in investment portfolios. In addition, Trump's broader subversive policies "woke up" the EU, leading to a projected €800 billion increase in defence spending across Europe.
- 2. Elections in Germany marked the end of the restrictive fiscal policy initiated in 2009 (Merkel Schuldenbremse). The new government is launching a €500 billion infrastructure investment programme. Triton's Pan-European Fund returned +6.48% in Q1 2025, while the benchmark Stoxx Europe 50 index returned +5.50% over the same period.
