Investment Objective

The Fund's investment objective is to provide the unit holder with income and capital growth, by investing mainly in euro-denominated bonds of developed economies, in liquidity products, and to a lesser extent (no more than 10% of its assets) in shares. The Fund is actively managed and its purpose is to provide investors with long-term capital growth.

Investment Strategy

The fund mainly invests in fixed interest securities in euro, issued by EU country-members, organizations, financial institutions and corporations. The fund seeks to maximize total return and is not tethered to any benchmark. The investment team is focused on fundamental analysis to generate investment ideas, but also monitors the short-term movements of the market and conduct ongoing review of portfolio performance and risk characteristics.

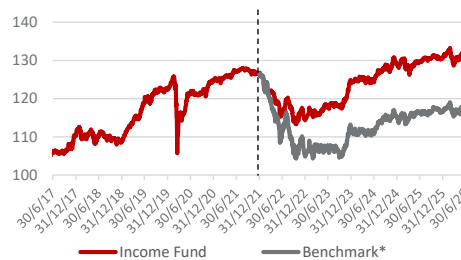

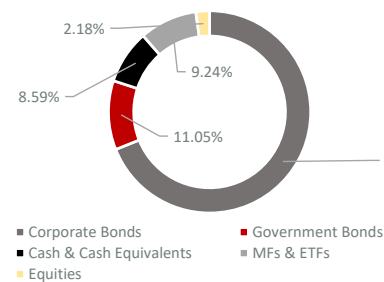

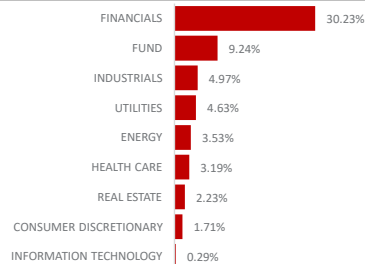

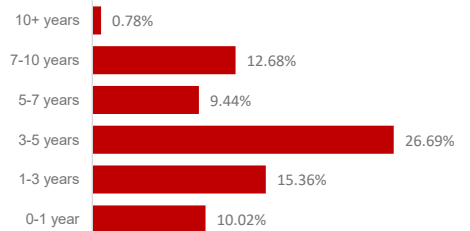
Asset Exposure

Q2 Commentary

Data during Q2 showed the first signs of the economic impact from the US-Iran conflict. Driven by higher energy prices, headline inflation rates jumped from March. Mounting input cost pressures for businesses were clearly visible in the PMI data. Yet reassuringly there was little sign of contagion as inflationary pressures elsewhere stayed relatively contained. Clear regional divergences also emerged: US activity data continued to trend upwards alongside the labour market strengthening. But, the eurozone, for example, started to show signs of demand destruction. The ECB kept rates unchanged in April and then delivered a 25bp hike in June a move widely expected. The outlook for US policy rates turned more hawkish, shifting from cuts to hikes. In the June FOMC meeting, half of the policymakers projected at least one 25bp rate hike by end-2026. In rates, 10Y yields rose in April amid elevated crude oil prices and persistent inflation concerns. In May, UST and JGB yields continued to climb, while EGB and gilt yields declined; the 30y UST yield surged to 5.20% on 19 May, its highest level in almost two decades, on inflation worries. In June, 10y yields fell across most major markets on moderating energy prices and cooling inflation expectations. Global IG spreads tightened marginally while HY credit spreads tightened substantially in Q2. USD HY and EUR HY spreads tightened sharply in April the largest monthly tightening since May 2025 and November 2023, respectively. This followed two consecutive months of widening through March driven by the Middle East conflict. During 1H2026, TRITON Income Fund posted a positive return of 1.65% against +1.30% of its reference benchmark, BLP Euro Aggregate Index.
